MUSIC CITY OPEN - August 30th through September 4th saw the Music City Open in Nashville, Tennessee host the annual men's and women's 9-Ball event. Ray Martin came out of the losers bracket to defeat Larry Hubbard in the finals to win \$16,000. Hubbard took 2nd for \$6,000. Mike Massey, coming in 3rd, earned \$4,000 for his efforts. In the women's division Lori Shampo defeated Robin Hansen-Bell, with Melanie Smotherman bringing up 3rd. The women's prize amounts, in order, were \$1300, \$950, and \$500.

BCA U.S. OPEN - The Billiard Congress of America reinstated their annual U.S. Open 14.1 tournament this year. The event was held in Detroit, Michigan on September 5-9th. These were the results:

NPBA AND OLD MILWAUKEE BEER TEAM UP FOR TEAM CUP

OLD MILWAUKEE TEAM CUP TOURNEY: Local qualifier competition for the "\$115,000 Old Milwaukee Beer Team Cup National 8-Ball Championship" will begin October 9, 1983. For four consecutive weeks, two player teams will compete in a round robin format in their local rooms or taverns. The top 50% of these teams will advance to the Sub Regionals beginning February 10, 1984. An additional local four week session will begin November 13, 1983, with the top 25% advancing to the subregionals. Thus an advantage in early entry.

Sub regional winners will then compete in regional tournaments to start March 23, 1983. The culmination of all will send the winning eight teams from each regional to the National Championship on May 16, 17, and 18th of 1984. The final event will be held at the Imperial Palace Hotel in Las Vegas, Nevada. Qualifiers for two divisions, open (men and/or women, any combination) and womens only can be held in any pool room or tavern across the nation. However, because of current laws prohibiting liquor promotions, these states will not be eligible to participate:

NO TROUBLE IN RIVER CITY FOR HUBBART AND CAMPOS

TEXAS RIVER CITY OPEN: August 27, 1983 Larry Hubbart won the Texas River City Open with a narrow 11 to 10 game victory over Jimmy Rempe in the finals. \$9200 was Hubbart's 1st place prize. Rempe won \$5200 for 2nd place and Buddy Hall took third for \$2825. On the women's side, Belinda Campos stomped on Lori Shampo, winning \$1300 for her 9 to 4 victory. Shampo received \$900 for her 2nd place finish. Robin Hansen-Bell finished 3rd with \$600.

DATE SET FOR 3RD ANNUAL DENVER OPEN

DENVER OPEN: December 8, 1983 is the scheduled date for the 3rd Annual Denver Open. The format will be 9-Ball, double elimination, one foul, ball in hand. The entry has been set at \$235. Late entry \$275. This event is promoted by Frank Burgess, owner of Colfax Billiards in Lakewood, Colorado and the NPCA. NPCA sanctioning gives the winner of the 1983 National Pool Classic, Classic III, free entry into the Denver Open the following week. The winner of the Denver Open receives free entry into a 1984 NPCA regional.

The 1981 Open was won by Tom Spencer, the title was taken over in 1982 by Mike Sigel. Who will take the 1983 title? For more information on the Denver Open, contact Frank Burgess, (303) 232-9847.

NORTHWEST AND CENTRAL REGIONAL REPS PICKED

As the Northwest Regional Representative, Sue Warnes will be instituting the new 1984 NPCA Format in Idaho, Montana, Oregon, Washington, Wyoming and Alaska.

One of today's top women professional players, Sue has the unique distinction of winning two NPCA State Titles in 1983, the Washington State 14.1 and 9-Ball.

Her achievements as the Washington State Rep include the scheduling of six State Title Tournaments and enlisting the following establishments as Proprietor Members: MUSTARD SEED TOO - BELLVUE, WASH., SUN VILLA LANES - BELLVUE, WASH., 211 BILLIARD CLUB - SEATTLE, WASH., and the SOUTH HILL SALOON - PUYALLUP, WASH.

DION WOOLEY, the 1983 Kansas and Missouri State Rep was rocketed into national prominence with her 1982 National High School Championship during her senior year at the NPCA Classic II. During 1983, Dion qualified and competed in the Las Vegas 8-Ball Promotions Tournament and the recent BCA 8-Ball Nationals.

Dion will be the Central Regional Rep for North and South Dakota, Kansas, Missouri, Nebraska and Minnesota. As a State Rep, Dion scheduled 4 NPCA State Title events and signed up the following establishments as Proprietor Members: KING LUDIE LANES NORTHLAND - KANSAS CITY, MO., CHALK AND CUE - ST. JOE, MO., AND J. RIGGS WEST - MANHATTAN, KS.

THE NATIONAL POOL CLASSIC ASSOCIATIONS annual sanctioned pocket billiard championships will be arrived at through a revamped format for the 1984 NPCA Tournament Season that culminates in December of 1984 at Classic IV.

TO IMPLEMENT THE QUALIFYING TOUR, the NPCA has divided the nation into eight Regions. Players can begin competing in local qualifiers for the Regional Title Tournaments as early as November 1, 1983. Winning a local qualifier gives the player a spot in one of the four Title Events in a Region. By winning four local qualifiers throughout the Tour Season, a player can obtain entry into all four of the Title Tournaments in the Region. Separate local qualifiers will enable the female players to qualify to compete in the Women's Regional Title Tournaments. Two of these events will be scheduled for each of the eight Regions.

THE REGIONAL TITLE TOURNAMENTS will be scheduled to take place at Member NPCA facilities in each Region during September and October of 1984. In the Men's division, each Regional Title Tournament will be limited to the first 64 qualifying players. Based on a full field, a Regional will have a prize fund of \$3,200.00 and pay 8 places. Included in this prize fund will be four paid entries into Classic IV at \$400.00 each. The Women's Regionals will be limited to the first 32 qualifying players and will pay \$1,600.00 which includes four, \$300.00 paid entries for the first through fourth place finishers into Classic IV.

CLASSIC IV WILL FEATURE THE 16 men players from each of the eight Regions which will fill the 128 man field playing for \$50,000.00 plus added, and 64 women players in their own event competing for over \$20,000.00 plus added.

POCKET BILLIARDS SANCTIONING BODY FOR LOCAL STATE AND NATIONAL COMPETITION

Each of the above Regions will be represented by a Regional Representative. This individual will be appointed by the NPCA Board of Directors to assist in selecting locations for the 6 Regional Title Tournaments (4 men's events and two women's events) in their area to be run during September and October of 1984. The Regional Representative will also promote the sport and assist the Board in soliciting other Proprietor Members who will be the sites for regular local qualifying events for the Regionals.

PROPRIETOR MEMBERSHIP - The annual dues for proprietor members will remain the same for the 1984 Season. The \$100.00 annual Proprietor Membership allows the Member to use his facility for sanctioned NPCA events such as the local qualifying tournaments. Proprietor Members interested in hosting a Regional Title Tournament for their area should contact their Regional Representative or The NPCA Tournament office at the beginning of the Season.

PLAYER MEMBERSHIP - The Players Memberships are on a Seasonal Basis and expire with the cut-off dates for sanctioned events each season. All Player Members must renew their memberships after October 31, 1983 to compete in sanctioned events after that date. The 1984 Season Player Memberships will be \$15.00. Under the new format, players must be NPCA members to compete in NPCA Local Qualifiers, Classic Regional Title Tournaments or the National Pool Classic.

SUSTAINING MEMBERSHIP - The manufacturers, distributors, wholesalers, retailers and other related business' to the pool industry are solicited for their support through a Sustaining Membership. These dues are due annually and will be set at \$250.00 beginning with the 1984 Season. Sustaining Members receive mention in the NPCA's annual publication The Pocket Billiard Almanac which serves as the Sanctioned Rules and Records for the association. Sustaining Members are also offered the opportunity to exhibit during the National Pool Classic each year.

LOCAL QUALIFYING TOURNAMENTS - These events will be held in NPCA Proprietor Member facilities (rooms, taverns, bowling lanes, universities ..etc.) during the 1984 Tour Season which begins November 1, 1983. The cut-off date for these events will be August 31, 1984. NPCA player members may compete in any qualifying event in any Region. Winning a qualifying event in a Region earns the player an entry into one of that Regions Title Tournaments. Winning a second qualifier in the same Region earns the player an entry into the second scheduled Regional Title Tournament for the Region. A player can qualify to play in all four (men's div.) or both (women's div.) of the Title Tournaments in a particular Region. Again, only NPCA Player Members can compete in these events. Players should be prepared to show proof of membership (1984 Membership Card). The Proprietor submits the list of players with a \$25.00 sanction fee and a tournament report giving the winners name along with \$50.00 of the prize fund for the winners entry into the Regional to the NPCA with a Sanction Report Form. The first 64 players to win qualifying events in a Region will comprise the field for the first Regional Title Tournament in that Region (32 players women's div.).

REGIONAL TITLE TOURNAMENTS - There will be four of these events for men and two for women in each in each of the eight individual Regions. These events will be scheduled to take place at NPCA Proprietor Members facilities during September and October of 1984. Based on a full field, each men's Regional will have a total prize fund of \$3,200.00 (\$50.00 \times 64 players) and each women's Regional will have a total prize fund of \$1,600.00 (\$50.00 \times 32 players). These prize funds will have been held in escrow by the NPCA as a result of the Local Qualifying Tournaments. The top four finishers in each Regional Tournament will be awarded an entry (\$400.00 MEN & \$300.00 WOMEN) into Classic IV. These entries will be paid from the Regional Prize fund and escrowed by the NPCA for the Classic. Each of the eight Regions will qualify 16 men (4 from each regional tournament) players and 8 women players for Classic IV. If a player competing in a Regional has already qualified for the Classic, the next runner-up will receive the entry into the Classic.

In the event that any particular Classic Title Event does not have a full field, the tournament will be open to the first paid at-large entry fees of \$75.00 (\$50.00 prize fund, \$25.00 NPCA non-qualifying penalty). However, each at large entry must have competed in a minimum of four (4) local qualifiers to be eligible. (Women's Division Regional - minimum of two (2) local qualifiers.)

As you can see, many of today's top professionals have already earned their place in this event by way of capturing sanctioned State Titles, Major Titles or by accumulation of Classic Points in local tournaments.

CLASSIC III is limited to a field of 128 men players and 64 women players. The above list already accounts for 28 spots in the men's field and 19 in the women's field. It is estimated that through the NPCA Sanctioned Programs, an additional 30 men and 15 women will qualify. This only leaves room for 70 open entries in the mens division and 30 open entries in the womens division. One hundred per cent of all open and partial entries will be escrowed for the prize fund. In addition, the NPCA adds money from it's seasonal programs to this prize fund. Based on a good turn-out, the prize fund could reach over \$35,000 in the mens division and \$12,500 in the womens division. Assuming these goals are met, the mens division will be paying 32 places with a \$10,000 first place down to a 32nd place prize of \$400. The womens field will pay 16 places with a \$4,000 first place down to a \$300 16th place.

The NATIONAL POOL CLASSIC is the exciting climax to each years pool season. The finishers in the top four places during the last two seasons include Mike Massey, the current 1982 National Champion who unseated Tom Spencer, the 1981 National Champion. The women's 1982 Champion was Vicki Frechen who replaced Pam Miller, the 1981 National Champion. Runners-up in 1982 were: Paul Campbell, Earl Strickland and Jimmy Reid along with Julie Fitzpatrick, Cathy Collard and Jeanne Tomasello.

To participate as a player, complete the enclosed entry form as soon as possible (\$350.00 MEN & \$250.00 WOMEN - non members add \$10.00 '83 season membership). Due to the limited fields, we can only accept entries on a first paid basis.
